St Silas CE Primary School

We feel very strongly that physical activity and achieving in PE are extremely important.

We have high expectations around the planning and delivery of our PE curriculum and children's engagement with PE and physical activity.

We expect all children to wear the school PE kit for their PE lessons. We heavily subsidise the cost of PE kits for all children in order to ensure that any barriers relating to financial disadvantage are removed.

Our Aim

To use Primary PE and Sport Premium funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of our PE, School Sport and Physical Activity (PESSPA). We will do this by building capacity within our schools to ensure that improvements are sustainable and will continue to benefit current and future pupils. We will develop and add to the PESSPA activities that we already offer.

Key Areas

We will

- increase confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport (CPD).
- increase engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity and sport.
- raise the profile of PESSPA across school.
- aim for inclusion of all pupils in a range of sports and physical activities.
- increase participation in competitive sport (competitions).

Our PE Curriculum

A wide range of PE is delivered, which aims to engage and inspire all pupils. We believe in embedding positive experiences of PE and sport, through providing opportunities to take part, play and compete in a range of activities in order to enhance pupils' understanding of and ability to lead prolonged active and healthy lifestyles. We are fully committed to ensuring that all pupils receive well-planned PE sessions delivered by a PE specialist and supported by confident and well-trained staff. We have an up-to-date PE scheme of work to reflect the requirements of the National Curriculum.

Pupils at St Silas CE Primary receive 1 x 60-minute curriculum PE lesson and 1 x 60-minute additional PE session each week. The curriculum lessons are taught by our specialist PE teacher; the additional sessions are delivered by specialist coaches from local cricket, tennis, basketball, boxing and swimming clubs.

Sustainability

We aim to use our Sport Premium funding to create a sustainable curriculum for all children. Some of the money provided by the funding will be invested in the professional development of staff and as a result will enhance the quality of teaching for all children. We invite different specialists into our school, who coach teachers and work alongside them in a range of sports. Due to their influence and expertise, all teachers will have the chance to develop their teaching of PE and will team-teach with a specialist to increase their knowledge, skills and confidence.

As well as our regular PE lessons, we provide a range of sport based competitions, activities and lunch time activities to enhance interest and engagement in sport across the school. We also provide Annual sports-days for EYFS, KS1 and KS2 as well as inter-trust competitions in which children join with pupils from other REMAT schools. This year, we have expanded our offer of competitions so that they focus on a wider range of games and sports, and also so that each competition is focused on either 'excellence' or 'aspire' in order to ensure that participation is not limited to those children who may be more naturally gifted.

Participation

The school is keen to provide a wide range of extra-curricular clubs for pupils. We have a number of sports teams that compete in local competitions against other schools, including girls and boys football, swimming, dodgeball, basketball, netball, athletics and cross-country. Other after school clubs include KS1 & KS2 multisports, football, boxing, basketball, and breakfast/after school clubs that

include participation in PE. We regularly signpost particularly talented children to local clubs e.g. athletics, football, cricket, basketball, swimming, gymnastics, hockey, golf and tennis. We also attend 'aspire' competitions aimed at engaging SEN pupils with sports and PE.

Sports Premium Summary Costs

The aims of our spending are to:

- Develop fitness and well-being through the participation of high quality lessons.
- Provide opportunities for pupils through after school sports clubs.
- Develop sporting excellence by providing targeted extra-curricular clubs.
- Develop sporting excellence through a range of activities to enable children to compete.

Conditions of Funding

Primary PE and Sport Premium funding cannot be used for the following:

- Capital expenditure - schools can only use PE and sport premium funding for revenue expenditure.
- Employing coaches or specialist teachers to cover PPA time (this should be funded from the school's core staffing budgets).
- Buying staff PE kit.
- Teaching the minimum requirements of the national curriculum. The curriculum should be funded through the school's core funding (this includes swimming lesson except 'top-up' lessons).
- Buying services that will be delivered or used in following academic years (this includes paying for invoices and subscriptions in advance).

No funding can be carried over into the following academic year.

Capital expenditure for the purposes of this grant funding is defined as: *'The purchase of an asset (tangible or intangible) or expenditure which adds to/enhances and not merely maintains the value of an existing asset'.*

The following table documents that is spent using the Primary PE and Sports Premium fund. It also tracks the impact that this has on pupils at school.
